

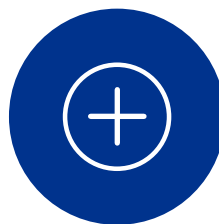
# The road to your future at IE Business School in 5 steps

## 1 WHAT



- With the **Priority Admissions Process** you can find out the Admission Committee's decision earlier in the admissions cycle.
- Make sure to submit your online application, including all required documentation, between May 15th and June 30th.

Note: Please remember that requested documentation may vary depending on the individual master program. Contact your admissions advisor or check the program website for further information.



## 2 WHY

- Get the final decision on your admissions application after just two weeks.
- Avoid the possibility of being put on a waiting list.

You will receive a final decision two weeks after your completed application has been submitted and your admissions interview has taken place.

## 3 HOW



- Start your online admissions application on [www.ie.edu/app](http://www.ie.edu/app)
- Have all required documentation ready.
- For programs which require students to complete entrance exams, make sure you are aware of the dates and locations of the tests as they apply to you. If taking the IE Global Admissions Test (GAT), contact your local representative for more information.
- Submit your online application, making sure to attach all relevant documentation, between **May 15th and June 30th**.



## 4 WHEN

- Although we have a rolling admissions process, the Priority Admissions lasts from **May 15th until June 30th**.

Important: After the deadline, applications are still open on a rolling basis. However, they will not qualify for the **Priority Admissions Process**.

- The **Priority Admissions Process** is available to candidates seeking to enroll in any of the following master programs. This only applies to the upcoming intake of each program:
