He/she is expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses on the political, social, and economic challenges and opportunities brought by new technological trends such as Big Data, Digitalization, Automation, and Artificial Intelligence. He/she should know the current state of these technologies and reflect on their implications for governments, the private sector, educational systems and society.

He/she should also be willing to collaborate with the IE's Center for the Governance of Change, a newly created institution that seeks to enhance our ability to understand, anticipate, and manage technological innovation and its externalities in a variety of domains — political, economic, and societal. Applications should include a cover letter and vita, 1-2 current research papers (including the job-market paper), three academic references, a 1-page statement of teaching philosophy, and evidence of teaching excellence (e.g., teaching evaluations). A PhD degree from a recognized department of Political Science or Public Policy is required. Entry-level ABD candidates must demonstrate clear evidence that the PhD will be complete by July, 2018.
