The successful candidate will have a strong publication record of monographs and peer reviewed articles, or the proven potential of producing them in the coming two years. We are especially, though not exclusively, interested in candidates with knowledge of the latest developments in technologies impacting global economic governance such as Blockchain, FinTech and others.

Candidates will be expected to teach courses in International Political Economy, International Trade, and International Finance, as well as core courses in Micro- and Macro-Economics. Furthermore, they should show acumen for innovative and applied teaching methods, with a focus on critical thinking and problem solving.

Beyond these traditional academic criteria, we seek academics with the capacity to engage in meaningful and policy relevant work, and to participate in contemporary policy debates. As well, we seek faculty members to be institution-builders: to apply for research grants, participate in affiliated research centers and academic programs, and expand IE's current partnerships.

Applications should include a cover letter and vita, 1-2 current research papers (including the job-market paper), three academic references, a statement of teaching philosophy, and evidence of teaching excellence (e.g., teaching evaluations). A PhD degree from a recognized department of Political Science, Public Policy, International Relations, or Economics is required. Entry-level ABD candidates must demonstrate clear evidence that the PhD will be complete by July, 2019.
