### How to qualify as a Solicitor in the UK?

Students from the Bachelor of Laws who later pursue an LLM with King's College OR Students from the Bachelor of Laws or Dual Degrees with Law at IEU. Two options:

- 1. SQE route = Solicitors Qualifying Examination (started in Autumn 2021)
  - SQE1 Exam: focuses on practical legal knowledge
    - > SQE2 Exam: focuses on practical legal skills
      - Two years' full-time (or equivalent) Qualifying Work Experience this can be obtained during or after students sit the SQE assessments
        - Character and suitability requirements
          - > SOLICITOR

- Traditional route: Graduate Diploma in Law (GDL) + Legal Practice Course (LPC) + Training Contract (TC). This route is still available for students who started their studies before Autumn 2021. They can still qualify through this route up until 2032.
  - Scraduate Diploma in Law could be required depending on the Bachelor degree
    - ➢ Legal Practice Course − 1 year
      - Training Contract 2 years
        - Professional Skills Course
          - > Character and suitability requirements
            - > SOLICITOR

- PGDip (1 year) Post Graduate Diploma in Law and Professional Practice (Foundations of Law)
- MSc (2 years) Master's level law degree (Foundations of Law + Skills and practice areas)

## Desired profile / ideal candidate

#### **Perfect Candidate**

- > Academic Experience Excellent GPA with outstanding academic records (Honors and minimum Excellence)
- Corporate Law A genuine interest for Corporate Law with a preferable proven academic or professional experience (Honors or Excellence in Corporate Courses / Previous Corporate Internships / Extra Activities related to Corporate Field)
- Languages Fluent in English (mandatory) and one or two additional languages
- Extra Activities Participation in activities such as: Moots / Legal Clinic / LawWithoutWalls / Young Corporate Program / President of IE Clubs / Class Representative / Mentoring / etc
- International Background Show and Demonstrate an International Experience and Diverse Culture Backgrounds (Volunteering Programs / Internships Abroad / Exchange Programs)
- Soft Skills Resilience / Communication Skills / Analytical Ability & Critical Thinking / Commercial Awareness / Presentation Skills
- > Participate in the UK Journey since the 1<sup>st</sup> Year (this increases the chances to secure a Training Contract):
  - 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Years: Open Days
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Years: Vacation Schemes
- You SHOULD APPLY to all the vacancies available in a customized and tailormade approach. It is a matter of quantity WITH quality.
- You SHOULD NOT focus your speech only talking about yourself, rather than THE COMPANY and the value the opportunity will add to the COMPANY and for your development.

## **Opportunities in the UK**

- **Open Days:** application deadlines vary a lot from one firm to other, as law firms host this kind of events in different moments throughout the year.
- Summer Vacation Schemes: application periods usually opened until January 31<sup>st</sup> of the year in course.

Participation in Open Days and Vacation Schemes is highly valued by law firms and increases the possibilities of securing a TC or any other work experience within law firms in the UK.

- **Training Contract:** very important to start applying since the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of studies. Usually opened until July 31<sup>st</sup> of two years in advance (for big firms).
- Qualifying work experience 2 years: work experience/s (maximum four experiences) under the supervision
  of a Solicitor or Compliance Officer for Legal Practice (COLP) that can take place in a wide range of organisations
  providing legal services. This experience/s can be carried out during or after the SQE assessments. For more
